What is the largest budget you have overseen and how did you prioritize spending?	I have overseen a budget of approximately \$25 million in a city here in Northwest Florida. The city had a weak system of cash flow and therefore whenever something was needed they just took on more and more debt to finance it. We had to look closely at major spending requests to try to function efficiently without acquiring more debt. It might mean only buying 5 police cars a year for a couple of years instead of buying 10 and having to finance all of the purchase.
Some people in our community say that we have traffic problems. What do you think? How would you mitigate those concerns or change the situation?	We do have traffic problems throughout the county not only at the beach. One thing that will mitigate the problem to some extent is the completion of major projects that have been ongoing for years such as the widening of highway 390 from 23rd street to highway 231.

Public education is one of the most important quality of life issues that I hear about. Everyone wants their children to receive a first-class education. Public education is in a crisis right now. The school board does a great job trying to stay on top of these problems. The biggest two, in my opinion, are the empty teaching positions. We have lowered the bar and lowered the pay the teachers receive (by not giving appropriate raises) and it has caused seasoned teachers to leave and be replaced by teachers who are not well trained. This is evident of our scores we receive from FL Dept of Ed every year. Improving education starts by improving the effectiveness of

teachers. No one single factor impacts our schools more greatly than our teachers. Next, I would say mental health issues and students who are classified as homeless (due to no permanent address/not that they necessarily live on the streets) is another area where we need to address and come up with a plan. I helped by joining student health advisory committee and working with school system to educate myself first on the problem, then spreading the word. We need more state funding.
