By working hand-in-hand with the school system, and both of our colleges so that they have a curriculum base that feeds the job market with a trained skilled workforce. By continuous improvement in our school system and colleges, we will build bench strength so that we can fill every job and attract more and more industry.

There are currently 1900 homes planned for the liberty subdivision with 200 on the ground. There are 300 homes plan for the park brook subdivision along with 120 town houses. Sweet Bay just expanded their footprint going from 3500 to 4200 residences with nearly 400 on the ground. The Morningside subdivision of 231 is 160 more homes. The city participated on all of these projects by providing incentives, such as roads, or infrastructure help to expedite them. There are 400 apartments being built on Jenks Avenue and 15th St. Saint Joe has built 240 apartments off star Avenue. There is a 600 unit apartment project in the development stage on Nehi Road. Public housing is being rebuilt at the park at

What is the largest budget you have overseen and how did you prioritize spending?	The 2022 budget of the LEAD Coalition of Bay County is \$600,000, and I grew that budget from \$64,000 in 2015. That is the largest budget that I have overseen. Budget priorities are mission driven first by the organization overall mission that directs our grant and private funding applications and secondly by the terms of those deliverables.

My goal would be to work with high-demand industries and work with our housing industries to ensure as a city we have what we need to attract a talented workforce and create a robust process to bring the workforce with a matching housing component. Bring in the workforce that has salaries that match the rising cost of housing. Bring industries that have longevity, employee growth, and salaries that can provide what is needed to keep a talented workforce in our city

Another important issue identified in the Chamber's Business Plan and Legislative Priorities is affordable workforce housing. What ideas do you have to address workforce housing?

Some of my ideas include: Staring the already Infill Program that the city is starting to offer developers/contractors to build homes on lots that the city owns to create an uptick in housing options for working adults. Create housing with mix units that can accommodate the diverse workforce that we have. Housing for students, low/middle income, veterans, seniors., etc.. And create a housing component that encourages positive reinforcement with our local workforce. Another idea is to create micro-unit single residents. This idea provides a housing component of shared housing with a shared workforce. This might require ordinances and regulation changes but it would offer a solution to
